We deliver the full Diploma Programme with a range of subject options and yet with small class sizes, never exceeding 16 students per teacher. Moreover, our teachers stay abreast of the latest trends and methods in delivering the rigours of the Diploma Programme, attending IB conferences on an annual basis.

Owing to our personalised approach to delivery and a highly dedicated teaching staff, every year our diploma candidates achieve truly excellent results far in excess of the global average. A broad & challenging curriculum

The IB Diploma Programme emphasises the development of the whole individual - physically, intellectually, emotionally and ethically. This is achieved through students studying six subjects from different curriculum areas in addition to central components that develop skills beyond the student's chosen subject curricula.



Group 1 Studies in Language & Literature

Students continue development in their mother tongue by developing a rich appreciation for the complexities and subtleties of texts in a variety of contexts.

Group 2 Language Acquisition

Cross-curricular components

Aside from offering a broad and challenging curriculum, the programme includes three important components. All IB Diploma candidates are required to successfully complete the Extended Essay, Theory of Knowledge course and 150 hours of extra-curricular activities in the areas of Creativity, Action and Service.

The Extended Essay

Engaging students to take an in depth study in an area of their interest, the Extended Essay is a research essay of sufficient depth to allow for a meaningful academic investigation. Students are supported by an advisor who has a background in the subject of investigation to offer advice, review drafts and suggest the next steps for the successful completion of the task.

Creativity, Action, Service (CAS)

All candidates are required to undertake 150 hours of extra-curricular activities over the two years of the Diploma Programme. Their time must give equal weight to exploring creative pursuits, sporting and athletic pursuits and serving the local and global community through charitable endeavours. Students keep a log of their achievements and experiences.

Theory of Knowledge (TOK)

Alongside the academic rigour of the IB Diploma Programme, the Theory of Knowledge component prompts students to analyse their own perceptions of knowledge and how we actually know things. TOK provides a thought-provoking conclusion to school-based education and is an excellent preparation for further study at university.







University life and beyond

IB Diploma candidates at BISC Kraków achieve excellent results, with annual average scores in excess of global figures. Armed with these results, our students have progressed to top universities around the world, including Oxford, Cambridge, the University of Bath, University College London, St Andrews, Aberdeen, Dundee, Heriott-Watt, Glasgow, Edinburgh, New York State and Kraków Jagiellonian University.

Preparing for exams is very much an individualised experience at BISC Kraków, as small class sizes and a wide range of subject offerings create an environment in which students find it easy to excel. In four of the last five years, IB candidates at BISC Kraków have achieved the incredibly impressive result of 40 points or more.

Students in their final years of school-based education and helped every step of the way with university admissions and managing the demanding pressures of the IB examination season. Our priority is to ensure that every one of our students gains admission to their first preference university, for which we have had wide success.


