# A supportive environment

Our philosophy is about encouraging students to take responsibility for their learning. We encourage critical thinking and active interaction in the classroom. To do so we offer a safe and nurturing environment. Our average class size is 15 pupils, meaning every pupil gets the support they need.

### Leadership of teaching & learning

We are creative and solution focused. We aim to continuously improve the quality of teaching, behaviour and safety. Our teachers focus on what happens in the classroom and have a strategic vision.

Lesson objectives are given at the beginning of each lesson. Teachers supply feedback to move learners forward.

Self-assessment and participation in their learning process challenges pupils every day. Teachers use lesson observations, self-evaluation and performance management to meet the school's educational targets.

Our teachers are dedicated and take part in on-going professional development.

### Contact with parents

As a small school we encourage close ties between teachers and parents. In addition to our regularly scheduled parent-teacher meetings, we welcome additional meetings with parents to discuss their child's learning.

Our Advisory Board, comprised of teachers, parents and school owners, is regularly consulted about school issues and suggestions are taken on board to ensure our school's continual progresses.

Our School Development Plan is published by the Head of School after consultation with the Advisory Board and Management Team. The plan informs parents and teachers of the educational direction of the school and establishes priorities for all members of our school community to work towards.

### Additional Learning Needs (ALN)

Students with additional or special educational needs are fully supported by a full-time ALN Coordinator who works with individual students and teachers to ensure every pupil is guided in the most appropriate ways to meet their goals. Our ALN Coordinator has an office on site and is available at all times.

### English as an Additional Language (EAL)

As an international school, we welcome children from all over the globe and as such, students who may be new to English. EAL programmes focus on communicative competency as the foremost priority. This includes the language needed to make strong social bonds and to excel in academia.

Our teaching takes a natural approach, drawing on leading linguistic theory on the acquisition of additional languages in childhood. At all times, EAL intervention programmes are fun and supportive places to learn, thrive and gain confidence in English.

As many of our students progress to universities in the United Kingdom and continental Europe, our EAL teachers also ensure students reach their full potential in tests of English language ability such as the IELTS, TOEFL and the Cambridge ESOL suite of examinations.





## **Ensuring success**

We follow the English National Curriculum delivered in an international context. As such, we invite students across the age range of the school to consider different cultural perspectives and reflect on their own learning within the wider world as is required for older students following the International Baccalaureate Diploma.

Our students obtain excellent results at IGCSE as well as IB and go to top universities in the UK and throughout the world, including Oxford, Cambridge, Bath, UCL, St Andrews, Aberdeen, Dundee, Glasgow, Edinburgh, New York State, Jagiellonian and Heriott-Watt.


